



Adolescent RIG RESEARCH LEGACY AWARD

PURPOSE OF THE AWARD: The purpose of this award is to recognize a senior researcher who has made outstanding contributions to adolescent health research and mentoring, and exemplifies high standards of scholarship and knowledge development in the field of adolescent health.

CRITERIA FOR THE AWARD

- Demonstrates unique, highly significant adolescent research focus based on dissertation/clinical inquiry project findings.
- Meets the eligibility requirements as listed below.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- The applicant has earned a research or practice doctorate degree > 5 years.
- The applicant should have conducted research focusing on issues related to adolescent health.
- The applicant is a member of MNRS and of the Adolescent Research Interest Group.
- Individuals can be either self-nominated or nominated by a current member of MNRS.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Nomination should include a brief statement (1-2 pages) of how the applicant's work has made a distinguished contribution to the science and/or practice of adolescent health.
- Include a current copy of the applicant's curriculum vitae.
- Two letters of support speaking to the applicant's research related to the award criteria.
- An applicant may initiate the nomination, in which case the applicant is to acknowledge the nomination.
- The awardee must be willing to present her/his research at the Adolescent Research Interest Group meeting during the next annual conference.

NOTIFICATION

The award recipient will be notified January 2019. The award will be presented at the RIG Meeting during the Annual Research Conference. The awardee is encouraged to be present to receive the award and will be invited to provide a brief presentation (up to 10 minutes) of her/his research at the RIG meeting.
