



Palliative and End-of-Life Care RIG DNP PROJECT AWARD

DUE: December 3, 2019, 5:00 PM Eastern

PURPOSE OF THE AWARD: The purpose of this award is to recognize the contribution of a new investigator whose DNP practice project that results in system change is exceptionally meritorious and exemplifies high standards of scholarship and knowledge development in the areas of palliative and end-of-life care science and/or practice.

CRITERIA FOR THE AWARD

- The nominee must have recently completed (defended/presented) the DNP project within 1 year of the nomination deadline date.
- The DNP project contributes to the science and/or practice of palliative and end-of-life care and system change.
- The DNP project and system change findings are being disseminated at local and regional levels.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- The nominee must be a member of MNRS in good standing.
- The nominee must be a current member of the MNRS Palliative and End-of-Life Care Research Interest Group.
- The nominee must have recently completed (defended/presented) the DNP practice project within 1 year of the nomination deadline date.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Each online nomination should include:

- Letter of support (on a maximum of 2 pages on letterhead) from a DNP advisor or committee member that addresses the significance of the DNP project to advancing the science in the area of palliative and end-of-life care, as well as the meritorious level of scholarship demonstrated by the applicant
- DNP project abstract
- Current curriculum vitae
- The nominee must acknowledge her/his willingness to be considered for the award
- Individuals may self-nominate. Self-nominations should also include a statement from the nominee about how she/he sees her/his DNP project contributing to palliative and end-of-life science and/or practice.

NOTIFICATION

The award recipient will be notified January 2020. The award will be presented at the Research Interest Group Meeting during the Annual Research Conference. The awardee is encouraged to be present to receive the award and will be invited to provide a brief presentation (up to 10 minutes) of her/his research during the RIG meeting.
