The MNRS *Perinatal, Sexual, & Reproductive Health RIIG* is pleased to offer a call for abstracts for our 2022 Competitive Symposium titled, “**Inclusion and Health Equity in Perinatal, Sexual, and Reproductive Health.**”

Appropriate topics for this symposium include but are not limited to research related to:

- *Social and structural determinants shaping perinatal, sexual, or reproductive health inequities*
- *Perinatal, sexual, or reproductive health outcomes experienced disproportionately by minoritized and “invisible” populations*
- *Effects of social cohesion, connectedness, and individual and collective resilience on perinatal, sexual, or reproductive health*
- *Biomedical advances in perinatal, sexual, or reproductive health among high priority and under-represented populations*
- *Frameworks that acknowledge the sociopolitical conditions that create health inequities and clearly document the connection between these conditions and perinatal, sexual, or reproductive health*
- *Interventions that address systemic and structural issues and community-led intervention research informed by community priorities.*

Please submit 2 copies of your abstract (1 with authors’ names and contact information listed and 1 blinded) to Dalia Khalil (dkhalil@wayne.edu) with the subject “PSRH Competitive Symposium Abstract Submission” **by 11:59pm CST on Friday, July 23, 2021. Abstracts are to be limited to 350 words and include the following: Purpose/Background, Framework, Methods, Results, Conclusions.**

Abstracts will be scored by a review committee of RIIG members according to significance, innovation, and fit with the proposed symposium. A competitive symposium of the top 4-5 abstracts will then be submitted to MNRS for review. Applicants will be notified of outcomes by email in advance of the general call for abstracts. Abstracts that are not accepted as a component of this symposium may be submitted to the general call.
