PURPOSE OF THE AWARD

The purpose of this award is to recognize the early career contribution in nursing research and practice that has the potential to advance or translate the science of palliative and end-of-life care.

CRITERIA FOR THE AWARD

- The nominee's publication record reflects ongoing contribution to the science and/or practice of palliative and end-of-life care
- The nominee has disseminated findings at local, regional, and national levels

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- The nominee must be a regular member of MNRS and the Palliative and End-of-Life Care Research Interest and Implementation Group
- The nominee must have earned a doctoral degree within 10 years of the nomination deadline date

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Each nomination packet should include:

1. A statement from a mentor or peer colleague (1 page, single spaced) that addresses the significance of the nominee's contributions to the advancement of palliative and end of life science and/or practice
2. One publication (if "in press", include letter of acceptance) that demonstrates the quality and rigor of the nominee's work
3. Current curriculum vitae
4. Please be sure that all submitted materials are clearly identified with the nominee's name in the file name.
5. Individuals may self-nominate. Self-nominations should include item #1 above, the statement from a peer colleague that addresses their work.

NOTIFICATION

Applicants will be notified of the RIIG Awards Committee decisions in January of 2022. RIIG awards will be presented at the RIIG meeting and acknowledged during the Annual Research Conference. Each awardee is strongly encouraged to be present to receive the award.
