By joining us on Hivebrite, you'll be able to:

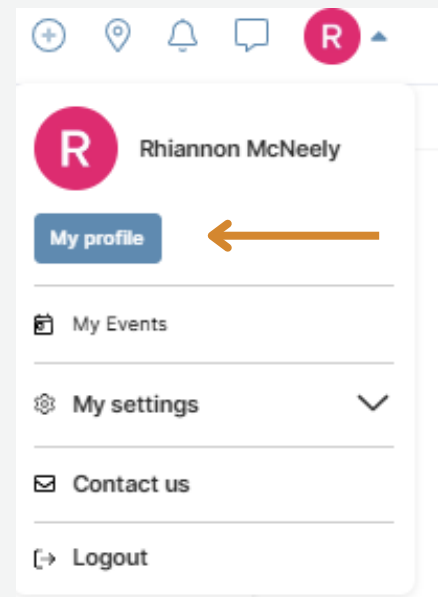

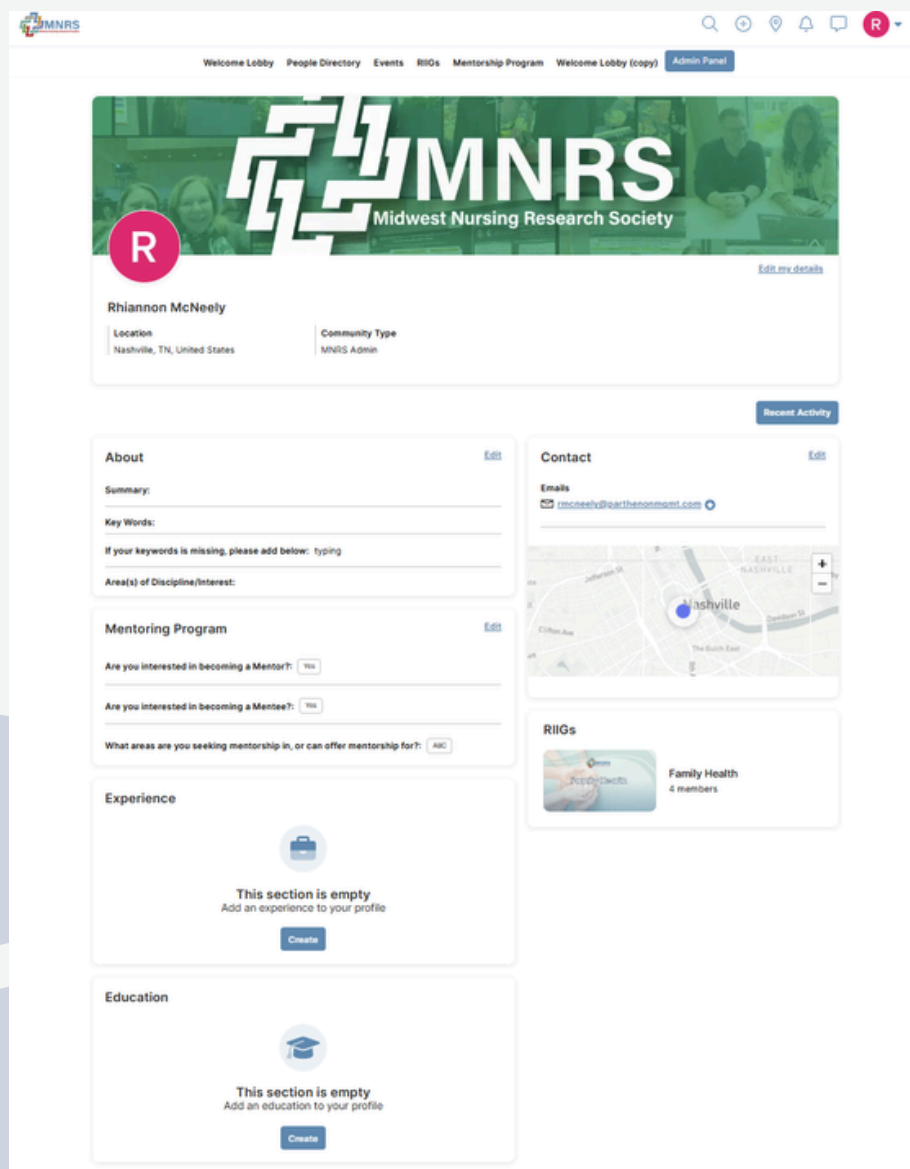


Your Hivebrite Profile

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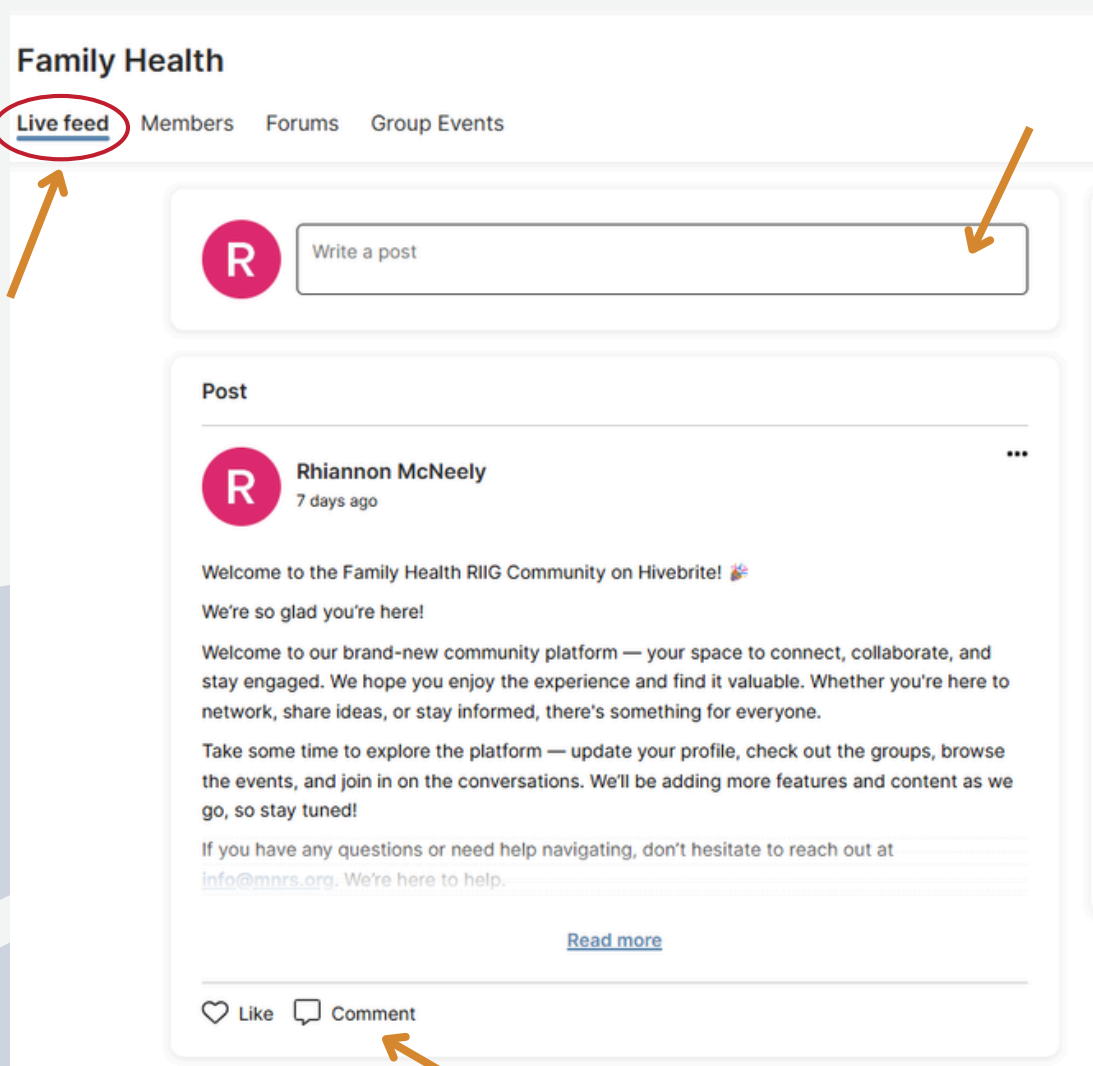




Functions Within the RIIGs, Committees & Groups

Members Page

The Members Page is where you can see who is part of your group or community within Hivebrite. 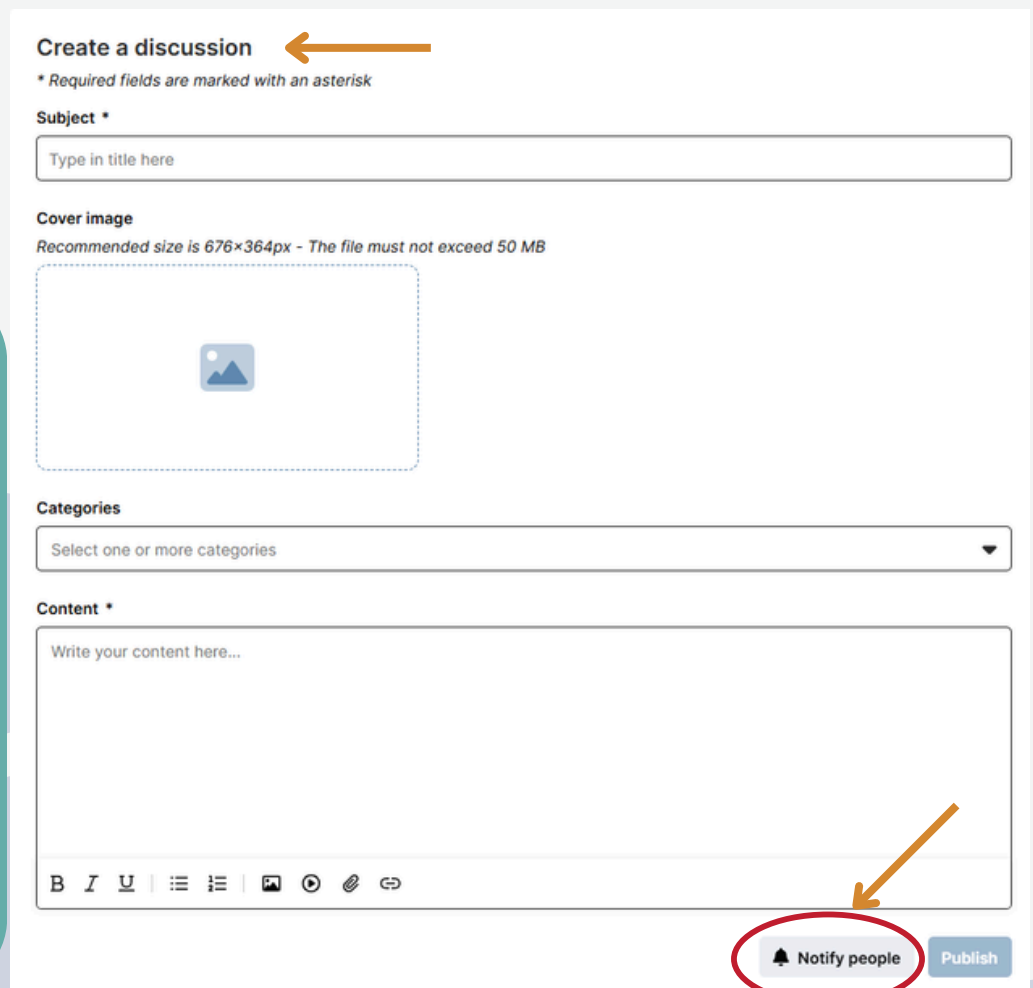
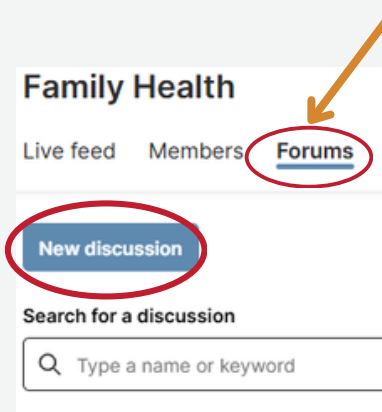

Forums Page

The Forums Page is a dedicated space for organized, ongoing discussions within your group or community. Unlike the real-time style of the Live Feed, forums allow for thoughtful, topic-specific conversations that can be revisited and built upon over time. One of the key features is the ability to easily filter discussions by category, making it simple to find topics that match your interests or needs. Members can post questions, share insights, seek advice, or start meaningful discussions on subjects relevant to the group. It's an ideal space to exchange ideas, deepen engagement, and support one another in a structured, accessible format.



You can enhance your forum posts by adding links, files, and media to support your message—and you have the option to notify your group once your discussion is published, ensuring it gets the visibility it deserves.

People Directory

The People Directory is a powerful networking and community engagement feature designed to help members connect with one another based on shared interests, expertise, and goals. Here's what you can typically expect from it:

Key Features

1. Search and Filter Capabilities:

- Search by name, location, areas of interest, or keywords.

2. Mentorship Matching:

- Match with a mentor or mentee based on profiles, interests, and goals.

3. View Detailed Member Profiles:

- Click on a member's name to view their full profile.
- See bios, career history, skills, interests, and any shared connections or group memberships.

4. Connect & Engage:

- Send messages directly to other members.
- Invite others to connect or collaborate within the platform.

5. Location-Based Search:

- See where members are located geographically, which is helpful for local networking or regional collaboration.



Mentorship Program

MNRS offers two mentorship options designed to support members at every stage of their career—whether you’re looking for quick advice or a more structured, long-term mentoring relationship.

Our mentorship programs are built to foster dynamic, inclusive, and collaborative connections that inspire growth across research, clinical practice, and professional development. With this flexible model, mentorship is not just a once-a-year opportunity, but an ongoing resource—whenever and however you need it.

Paired Mentorship Program

The Paired Mentorship Program offers a structured, year-long mentor–mentee relationship based on shared goals, interests, and areas of expertise. This program was redesigned based on member feedback requesting clearer expectations, improved matching, and stronger support throughout the mentorship cycle.

Program Snapshot

- 12-month commitment: March–February
- Monthly or bi-monthly virtual meetings
- Mentorship Kickoff Webinar in April
- Open to all MNRS members across career stages

How to Participate

Members apply as a mentor, mentee, or both during the annual application period. Matches are made by the Engagement Committee, and participants are supported throughout the year with resources and check-ins in the Hivebrite group.

Applications open in January of each year for this one-year program. The link will be available on the Hivebrite “Mentorship Program” tab.



Mentor on Demand

Mentor on Demand is designed for MNRS members who have one-off questions and want guidance without committing to a year-long mentorship.

This program removes the barrier of a “cold email” by connecting members with mentors who have already agreed to share their knowledge.

Common topics include:

- Career or educational decision-making
- Research and grant planning
- Re-entering clinical practice
- Exploring new roles or practice areas

How It Works

Mentors

Mentors can self-designate by adding the "Mentor on Demand-Mentor" tag in the member profile. You will then be automatically added to the Mentor on Demand Group.

*Mentors on Demand agree to occasional outreach via email or brief virtual conversations and to keep their Hivebrite profile updated and searchable.

Mentees

Members seeking guidance may join the Mentor on Demand group to ask questions or reach out directly to mentors. Mentors will be easy to spot with their Mentor on Demand-Mentor tag.

To join, Go to Groups and Search for the “Mentor on Demand Group” and click request to join.
